"The Artist Within"

Mixed media (acrylic on canvas & plastic mesh sewn onto paper), 6 x 6 cm, original.


The title is derived from the theme of VVM5. A stylized female form serves as the artist, who is within plastic mesh.

"Branching Out"

Mixed media (acrylic on canvas and wire woven into paper), 6 x 6 cm, original.

The title references the theme of VVM5. The wires radiate out of a stylized female form, representing the branching out or networking. Utilizing wire, my intention is also to draw an association with internet ("wired") networking.
